

Violation of the Taboos of Cannibalism. Sociocultural, Anthropological and Psychoanalytic Critique of Cannibalism

Summary

The violation of the taboo of cannibalism analyzed in the article draws on the psychological and philosophical critique of cannibalism. The first part of the article expands and presents the typology of cannibalism from the perspective of social and philosophical anthropology. The second part discusses biopsychological developments according to Sigmund Freud's psychoanalysis, during the development of which sexual outcomes can also

develop that can generate complexes or traumas that contribute to the violation of the taboo of cannibalism. Finally, the third part presents the case of Hannibal Lector, a cannibal, substantiating the psychoanalytic perspective of cannibalism - Hannibal Lector is a victim of childhood traumas. This allows the formation of the idea that when considering cannibalism, its violations, it is not expedient to use only the argument of the diversity of intercultural differences.
